Tessa and Lilly get together about every other week. In the 18 months since they were introduced, they have gone to local events like baseball games and movies in the park. They even took a day trip to Henry Vilas Zoo! These are new and exciting opportunities that Lilly would not have otherwise had.

In addition to all of the fun, Tessa is someone Lilly can turn to for advice when times get tough. Monica is glad that her preteen daughter has a trusted adult to provide a second opinion, joking that "nobody always wants to listen to mom!"

According to Alivia, it's easy to see the positive impact that mentoring has not only on Littles, but on Bigs, as well. She says Lilly's confidence has blossomed. The time she and Lilly spend together allows Tessa to de-stress and not worry about her other responsibilities.

"I don't even see it as a volunteering thing," Tessa said. "She's just become part of my life, part of my family. And as the relationship has gone on and growns, I've definitely noticed that I'm making an impact in her life."
