WHAT TO EXPECT

A minimum of 80 instructional/didactic hours and 80 clinical/practicum hours are required to meet Pathways Community HUB Institute (PCHI) training standards.

Training is five weeks long. Classes will take place in person from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. on Mondays and Tuesdays. The course instructor will notify trainees of schedule changes. Limited space available.

A Community Health Worker is a frontline public health worker who is a trusted member of and/or has an unusually close understanding of the community served. This trusting relationship enables the worker to serve as a liaison/link/intermediary between health/social services and the community to facilitate access to services and improve the quality and cultural competence of service delivery.
